

# SECURITY QUIZ at SUMMER FAIR SATURDAY 10 JUNE 2017

## Winner, answers and explanations

4 entries were submitted by the 30 June 2017 deadline for our Security Quiz at the Bingham Summer Fair.

Grateful thanks go to those four gallant participants and we hope you enjoyed the challenge.

Many congratulations to the lone winner, whose entry was the only correct one drawn out of the box and co-checked with impartial Library staff:

### First prize £20: Richard Barnett of Bingham

Recall that the following 10 answers were provided at the outset: Cycle Security Kit; Door Restrictor; Hidden Camera; Personal Attack Alarm; Purse Snatch Bell; Shed Alarm; Snatch Chain; Timer Switch; Tracking Device; Window Alarm

The explanations of the 10 cryptic clues are as follows:

- Qu 1. Clue: 'Timothy Short hesitated before exchange'  
Explanation: Timothy Short = Tim; hesitated = er; hence Timer; exchange = switch  
Answer: Timer Switch
- Qu 2. Clue: 'Remove panic'  
Explanation: remove = shed; panic = alarm  
Answer: Shed Alarm
- Qu 3. Clue: 'Anxiety after private assault'  
Explanation: private assault = personal attack; anxiety = alarm  
Answer: Personal Attack Alarm
- Qu 4. Clue: 'Like horse rider: attached to bay perhaps?'  
Explanation: bay = window; so, you'd attach a window alarm to window  
Answer: Window Alarm
- Qu 5. Clue: 'This made Dick, a vet, cringe to be confused'  
Explanation: Anagram of 'Dick a vet cringe' (confused)  
Answer: Tracking Device
- Qu 6. Clue: 'Mended a chair perhaps?'  
Explanation: 'Perhaps' suggests 'Mended a chair' might be arranged differently (anagram)  
Answer: Hidden Camera
- Qu 7. Clue: 'Alarm follows Yank seen pursuing bag'  
Explanation: bag = purse; Yank = snatch; bell = alarm  
Answer: Purse Snatch Bell
- Qu 8. Clue: '007 in period outfit'  
Explanation: 007 = Bond = security; period = cycle; outfit = kit  
Answer: Cycle Security Kit
- Qu 9. Clue: 'A sixth chance maybe if One Direction switches 90 degrees and unknown enters the mix'  
Explanation: Test if 'Snatch Chain' is the answer. Snatch Chain has 3 directions (S, N, N); switch one direction (N) 90 degrees to east (E); and add unknown (x). Snatch Chain then becomes Seatch Chainx; anagram for 'A sixth chance'  
Answer: Snatch Chain
- Qu 10. Clue: 'Bouncer?'  
Explanation: Bouncer (e.g. at night club, bar, etc) guards door and controls entry  
Answer: Door Restrictor
